Report of examination:

At the request of Mr Scott Darby, I have today examined the 2 year old chestnut gelding by Sebring from Fiery Sunset (Lot 98 at the Inglis Ready to Race Sale 2017) described above. The examination was limited to a clinical examination, an examination of the gait when led at the walk and trot, flexion and palpation of the joints, tendons and ligaments of the lower legs and an examination of the radiographs lodged at the Inglis Repository for the Ready to Run Sale.

At the time of the examination he was in good condition and showed no signs of illness or injury. He was still slightly immature because he was a late foal.

There were no signs of lameness when led at the walk and trot and there was no palpable thickening of the joints, tendons and ligaments of the lower legs.

Video scope examination was within normal limits with good even full abduction of the arytenoids. (Grade 1 Lane Grade). The radiographs lodged at the Inglis Repository showed no significant changes on any of the 50 radiographs taken.

Within the limits of the examination and at the time of examination the horse is, in my opinion a suitable subject for syndication.
